This event is being sponsored by the Southern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists in cooperation with the Pacific Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. All should understand that this is not a "proselytizing" event, as is often conducted by messianic churches, but is one that respects both Jewish and Christian religious traditions.

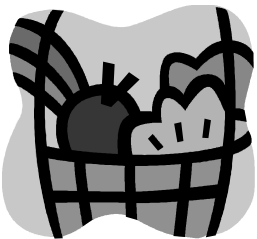
Big Brothers/Big Sisters
