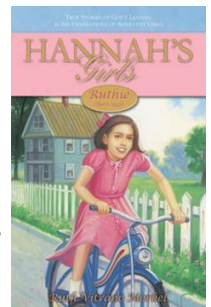

Title: **Hannah's Girls: Ruthie**

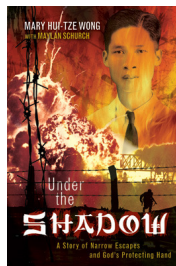
