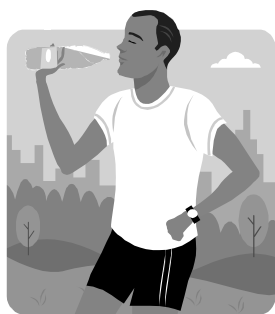

Book Shipping Procedures to Change

With the implementation of the new BookMaster software and in an effort to improve operation and control of our warehouse, Administrative Committee has approved the following changes that will take place in the Book Shipping Department beginning this coming Wednesday, July 25.

- ◆ Dale Tooley is the foreman for Book Shipping and, as such, is in charge.
- ◆ Corey Gunder is the assistant foreman, assisting Dale in the daily operation of the department and managing the department in Dale's absence.
- ◆ Dave Griffiths will serve as the liaison between any division or department within the house and Book Shipping. He will establish the department's priorities as needed.
- ◆ The access to the warehouse through the door near the breezeway will be restricted.
- ◆ Mail drop-off areas throughout the house will be created, which will reduce traffic going to Book Shipping to drop off outgoing mail.
- ◆ The Book Division will study the feasibility of creating a small post office in the bookstore that would provide mailing services to all employees for work or for personal needs.
- ◆ Employees of other departments are encouraged to get shipping information by phone instead of visiting the area.
- ◆ For information on price and delivery time, please call Judy Alexander or Tonya Ball at ext. 5261. For general information and questions, please call Corey Gunder at ext. 5264.
- ◆ A customer service station will be created at the entrance of Book Shipping through the Bindery. Employees coming to the Book Shipping area for service will be served there. In the event a customer service person is not at the station, they will be able to ring a bell for service.
- ◆ No unauthorized personnel will be allowed to enter the book warehouse/pick bin areas.
- ◆ Signs will be made and posted to inform people of access and customer service areas.
- ◆ Book Shipping employees will be asked to escort any person needing access to the warehouse or picking areas.
- ◆ Book Shipping employees will be asked to enforce the procedures.

The Review and Herald administration and the Book Division would like to thank you for your understanding and cooperation as these new procedures are implemented.
