“We are so thankful to you for remembering us in your prayers at the Review and Herald Publishing Association. We, the faculty and staff, are very grateful to you for your prayers and the letter of encouragement. We also remembered you and your staff in our prayers on that day.

“Our school was established in 1983 in a remote part of Karnataka state, in India. The school was established in the midst of a staunch Hindu community. In the initial stage there was great opposition from the community in establishing a Christian institution. However, by the

grace of God we were able to withstand and overcome all the difficulties. At present we have almost 725 students from nursery to 10th grade and almost 35 faculty members.

“Ninety-five percent of the children are from Hindu community, but Bible is still taught as an integral part of our curriculum. Various religious activities such as health and temperance contests (essay and poster), Bible contests, Week of Prayer, Vacation Bible School, and Pathfinders are conducted. Children are actively involved and included in these clubs.

“In addition, we have many other curriculum activities, such as annual sports, drawing competitions, educational tours, picnics, and a parents’ day program at the end of the year, with various activities. We invite all the parents, and they witness the program.

“The temperature goes to 45°C (113°F), and rainfall is 100 to 200 centimeters (3 feet 3.37 inches to 6 feet 6.74 inches). We also have winter. All our classes are conducted in temporary buildings, built of bricks and tin sheets. We are trying to build some comfortable classrooms. Kindly pray for us so that soon good classrooms will be built for our school.

The national Do Not Call registry was begun in June 2003 to prevent telemarketers from calling you to make cold sales. If you registered your phone number in this list, you may not remember that the list is valid for five years. In 2008 those first listings will expire, and your number will go back on the "OK to call" list next year. Renew your registration or register your number by visiting [www.donotcall.gov](http://www.donotcall.gov) or by calling 1-888-382-1222 to enroll again.



The Web site has lots of great information about rules for telemarketers, cell phone numbers, and more. When you receive a call, you can also ask the telemarketers to put your name on the do not call list. They are required by law to do this, and your number is on that list for 10 years. These suggestions can truly decrease the number of telemarketing calls you receive. Go have your supper in peace!
