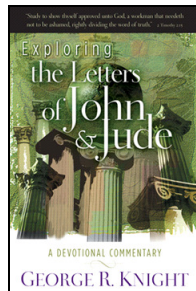
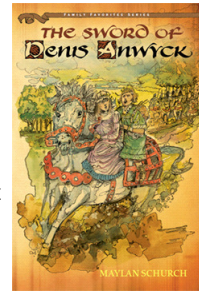
“Hey! Come back here!” shouted the steward.

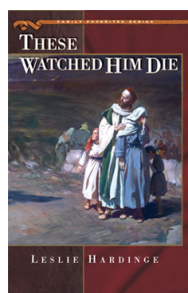
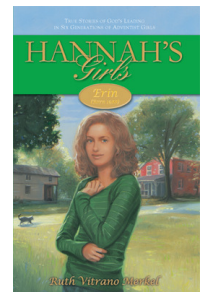
